
Q1 Which do you think should be the top priorities for transport spending in the next 5 years? Please tick up to 5 choices only.























### Q20 Have you heard of the TPS Professional Development Scheme (PDS)?



### Q21 Are you currently participating in the PDS?



## Q22 Over the next few years, which of the following will be most important, with 1 as the highest






