## **Lecture Synopsis**

The National Taichung Theatre is a major new cultural building in Taichung, Taiwan. It had a partial opening in 2014 and will officially open to public in 2016. For this building, architect Toyo Ito envisioned a new architecture that breaks away from the traditional Cartesian grid system to enrich the spatial experience. The structural engineering required to achieve this vision required Arup to take an innovative approach to both the design and construction methods.

Dr Christian Dercks the project engineer will describe the geometry, analysis, design and construction of this unique structure.

**The Garden Bridge** is a new garden in the heart of London, spanning across the Thames. With construction due to begin in early 2016 the project will be complete by summer 2018.

Dr Francis Archer the lead engineer will describe how the project came about, the vision the conceiver of the project Joanna Lumley had, the concept of her chosen designer Thomas Heatherwick, and how the lead consultants Arup have helped make this a reality.
